2025/26 TOWN COUNCIL BUDGET

The Town Council has recently considered its draft Revenue and Capital Budget for the 2025/26 financial year.

Clearly the budget that we set is important to our local community, both in terms of how our spending plans may impact on the provision of services and investment in assets for the benefit of the town, and in terms of the level of council tax that we need to raise from local taxpayers in order to fund these plans.

The Council has prepared a 2025/26 Revenue Budget that protects and maintains all services, facilities and events to current standards next year.

The Council is also maintaining some surplus resources within the budget which will allow it to continue to replenish its balances and reserves.

This will help ensure that we can continue to make capital investment in community assets such as our cemeteries, allotments, sports complex, parks and play areas, for the benefit of the community, in the coming years.

The Council has some significant capital investment commitments relating to its assets over the coming years and has agreed a substantial draft Capital Programme Budget of £666,600 for 2025/26.

Planned investment includes building maintenance works, replacement works machinery, essential computer replacements, football pitch drainage improvements, the upgrade of Aycliffe Village play area, play area surfacing replacement, solar panels, development of a woodland burial site, footpath repairs, tree works, and bus shelter repairs.

In approving the draft 2025/26 Revenue and Capital Budget, the Council has currently agreed to raise the Town Council proportion of the Council Tax bill by £7 per year (3.75%) for the vast majority of local taxpayers i.e. Those living in Council Tax Band A properties.

This increase would have been lower at 2%, had the Council not been facing an 18.5% cut in its Council Tax Support Grant by Durham County Council.

The Council appreciates that any increase in the monthly outgoings of our local taxpayers will not be popular. However, we hope taxpayers will agree that a monthly increase of less than 60p is a small price to pay to ensure that all the services provided by the town council can be protected for another year, and reserves replenished.

Please note that the Revenue Budget is currently under review following the recent Government Budget which will see a substantial increase in the Council's employers' national insurance costs and the Council may need to consider implementing a higher Council Tax increase to offset these additional costs.

AYCLIFFE VILLAGE CHRISTMAS TREE



Rather than purchasing a cut Christmas tree for Aycliffe Village green every year, the Council have taken the decision to purchase a Nordmann fir which has now been planted on the green in a similar place to where the cut tree was erected previous years.

Planting a tree is much more sustainable to the environment and will be trained each year to produce a perfect shaped tree. It would have been unlikely that a larger tree would survive and so the tree is currently approximately 5 to 6 feet tall, once the roots establish, it is hoped that it will soon develop and provide a pleasant tree for many years to come.

The main Christmas tree provided by the Town Council on Central Avenue, outside St Clares Church, will remain a cut tree of a similar size to previous years. It will be erected in late November along with the Christmas lights along Central Avenue, St Cuthberts Way and into Stephenson Way and Aycliffe Village.
